



York Rifle Range Association, Inc. Meeting Minutes for May 10, 2016

Call To Order

- The York Rifle Range Association meeting for May 10, 2016 was called to order by President Doug Nace at 7:30 pm with 20 members present.

Pledge of allegiance was recited by the group

Minutes of Last Meeting

- Minutes from the April 12, 2016 minutes were read by Recording Secretary, Jeff Walters.
- A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the minutes as read.

Treasurer's Report

- Club Treasurer, Ken Kreiger, read the report. Please see attached report located in the clubhouse.
- Financials will be audited at the end of the year.
- We received the audit report for 2015. The auditor reported that activities supported in the ledger is supported by the money in the bank account.

Membership Secretary's Report

- Membership Secretary, Jim Jensen, gave the report.
- Sixteen new senior members were voted on. A motion was made by Fred Haag, seconded by Dick Ide, and approved by membership to accept the new members into the club.
- One junior and four senior prospective members were introduced tonight and voted on at the June meeting.
- Membership roll is as follows: Total Membership: 1551, Senior: 1194, Junior: 68, Life: 286, Active Military: 3. Wait list is at 85.

Small Bore Report

- Greg Livingston gave the report.
- League has only had one outdoor match so far. Two matches were cancelled due to the rain and have been rescheduled.
- South team did win the first match, and the next match will be held at York on Friday May 13, 2016
- League banquet was held at the Onalantee gun club and three scholarships were awarded at the reception.

Big Bore Report

- Fred Haag gave the report.
- CMP finally posted the scores for the Highpower clinic held in March.

- Good turnout for the Garand match with 30 competitors. Those scores have been posted on the CMP website. There were 25 competitors for the afternoon NRA Highpower match. There were four unclassified shooters of which two were participants in the club's clinic.
- Next match will be held on May 22, 2016.
- Match target frames are being repaired from clinic and garand matches.

Junior Program

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Air rifle is going smoothly. The last three weeks has shown a slight drop in attendance. We have been averaging around 20 juniors. The past few weeks the attendance has been closer to 15 shooters. This smaller size has worked to our benefit. We are able to work one on one with the shooters and not try to rush them through.
- Most shooters are off the bench now and learning the various positions.

Building and Grounds

- George Himmlewright gave the report.
- We had our second work day on April 30th. We got the fallen tree cut up and stacked along the side of the rifle range. We replaced all the wood target frames at 50, 100, and 200 yards on the rifle range, added red paint on the no shoot zone. Damage was noted on the new frames two hours after they were replaced.
- We are going to try to keep up with removing the staples on the frames.
- We will try to keep up with the mowing, but with the rain it is proving difficult.
- Mole problem is particularly acute this year on the rifle range.
- Burn pile has been taken care of.
- Will spread weed & insect killer when time permits.
- President Doug Nace also thanked the volunteers who helped with the work detail.

Legislative

- Hillary Clinton is ramping up her Anti gun rhetoric during the presidential campaign.
- Gun rights rally will be held on May 24th on the capital steps.

Old Business

- Still getting prices for various projects around the club grounds.
- We did get into contact the head of the Republican women's group of York County who wanted to hold a shoot program at the club. She had a plan of having at least 50+ attendees, whereas at this point in time we can handle around 18 attendees. As of right now the plan has been shelved.
- Hunter Education class will be held on June 4th with 15 juniors already registered.

New Business

- Jeff Walters brought to the floor a suggestion to upgrade the "antique" smallbore rifles in the club's possession. Within a few months some of our junior air rifle shooters will be able to transition to smallbore and Highpower programs. A preliminary plan to liquidate the old rifles to create some seed money to purchase newer rifles will be introduced at the next meeting. As of right now first offer will be to sell to club members first, and then to expand to outside sources after the club members have first "dibs". End result will be to purchase new Anschutz 1903 rifles in both right and left hand versions.

Good or Welfare of the Club

- WPPL has finished for the winter season. York/Adams gold team was tied for 3rd place and Blue team came in 2nd place out of ten teams. We are always looking for new shooters to try bullseye shooting.
- There was a negligent discharge at Delta Peachbottom. A suggestion was made to look into a new trauma bags and an AED for the club.
