



York Rifle Range Association, Inc. Meeting Minutes for June 14, 2016

Call To Order

- The York Rifle Range Association meeting for June 14, 2016 was called to order by President Doug Nace at 7:30 pm with 18 members present.

Pledge of allegiance was recited by the group

Minutes of Last Meeting

- Recording secretary, Jeff Walters, gave the report.
- Dick Ide made a motion to approve with no corrections, Seconded by George Himmelwright. Minutes were approved by members present.

Treasurer's Report

- Club Treasurer, Ken Kreiger, made the report.
- Treasurer's report is located with the hard copy of the meeting minutes located in the club house.
- Finances will be audited at year end.

Membership Secretary's Report

- Membership Secretary, Jim Jensen, gave the report.
- Four new senior memberships and one junior membership were voted on during the meeting.
- A motion was made by Dick Ide to approve the memberships. This was seconded by Greg Livingston, and approved by the members present.
- Current membership roles are as follows: Senior: 1197, Junior: 69, Life: 286, Active Military: 3 Grand Total: 1555
- No prospective members were introduced during the meeting, Wait list is 89.

Small Bore Report

- Greg Livingston gave the report.
- The weather has been better, and the ICRL has completed three more matches in the summer outdoor season. South team is leading the north team by two points.
- Next match will be at York on the June 17th.

Big Bore Report

- Fred Haag gave the report.
- Last match held at York was on May 22nd. Due to poor weather we had only 10 shooters.
- Next match will be on June 26th.
- We will need help to run the the July 24th match, some of our regular shooters will be at Camp Perry. Dick Ide volunteered to run the July match.

Junior Program

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Attendance has been less since the summer vacation has started. We did not have air rifle on Memorial Day or the week afterwards due to a prior commitment.
- Most shooters are off the benches and learning the positions. Some are struggling with kneeling and standing but with the smaller group size we can do more one on one instruction.
- A plan was introduced to sell off the club's excess rifles and purchase four new Anschutz 1903 target rifles for the junior program.
- After some discussion and debate, Jeff Walters made a motion to sell the following club rifles, (3) Remington 513T, (5) Mossberg 144US, (5) Savage Mark II with Bushnell 3x9 scope, (1) Remington Model 770 caliber .270 Win w/scope, and (3) M1 Garand rifles. This was seconded by Fred Haag, and was approved unanimously by the members present. The club members will have first opportunity to purchase, and around mid winter any remaining rifles will be sold via an outside source. Notice will be made via website, newsletter, classified board in clubhouse, and word of mouth at various club events.
- Greg Livingston made a motion to go ahead and purchase one new left handed Anschutz 1903 rifle, and three new right handed Anschutz 1903 rifles for the sum of \$5880. This was seconded by Fred Haag, and approved unanimously by the members present.

Building and Grounds

- George Himmelwright gave the report. The following projects were tackled during the past month.
- 50 Ton of stone was purchased to spread in the parking lot, driveway, pad for the new shed, and access way to the 200 yard pit area.
- Gate has been repaired.
- Tractor has been serviced and the blades have been sharpened.
- Trees were trimmed along the edges of the range, 200 yard berm and the pit area.
- Al's Service center donated used tires that were added to the pistol range impact area.
- Weed & Feed and Bug-B-Gone spread and Round-Up sprayed to keep weeds in check.
- Replaced the 50 yard board that was stolen from the target frame.
- Contractor and member, Ron Huyett, has been very helpful in completing these projects.
- Looking towards replacing fridge and stove.
- Still waiting on bids to replace the 100 yard range roof.
- Upgrades to the indoor range will be completed soon, still waiting for some of the lighting fixtures.
- New shed will be arriving in a few weeks.

Legislative

- Same old, Same old on the legislative front. Increased pressure to limit our 2nd amendment rights due to the shooting in Orlando, FL. As always contact your representatives and vote pro 2nd amendment.

Old Business

- Club had hunter education class in early June. 27 students attended and all passed.

New Business
