



York Rifle Range Association, Inc. Meeting Minutes for 2/14/2017

Call To Order

- The York Rifle Range Association meeting for 2/14/2017 was called to order by President Doug Nace at 7:35 pm with 30 members present.
- Prior to the assumption of regular monthly business President Doug Nace presented a plaque to Ken Kreiger in honor of his years of dedicated service to the club. A hearty round of applause was observed by the members present. Thank you Ken for your years of dedicated and hard work for the club.

Minutes of Last Meeting

- Minutes of the 1/10/2017 were read by Recording Secretary, Jeff Walters. No corrections or additions were needed and a motion was made by George Himmelright and seconded by Dave Reihart to approve the minutes as read. A vote was taken by members present and the minutes were approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report

- George Himmelright read the financial report prepared by treasurer Cheryl Gerhardt.

- A year end audit was prepared by Timothy Marowsky. No problems were observed and his statement is included in the financial report.
- All club accounts will be audited at the end of the year.
- President Doug Nace also stated that expense for the the liability insurance in the report was for the bonding of the club officers, directors, and match directors and junior program.

Membership Secretary's Report

- Membership Secretary, Jim Jensen gave the report.
- Membership totals are as follows: Senior: 1069, Junior: 56, Life: 316, Active Military: 3, Total Membership: 1444
- Current Wait list: Senior: 124, Junior: 2
- Presented to membership for approval at the March meeting Senior: 26, Junior: 2. Names were read to the members present and they will be voted on at the March meeting. Names will be posted in the clubhouse in the interim.

Small Bore Report

- Greg Livingston gave the report.
- We had four matches since the last meeting against Seitzland, Palmyra, North End Postal, and Bye week. No points earned since the last meeting.
- Next match will be this Friday at North End.

Big Bore Report

- Fred Haag gave the report
- Nothing really new.
- CMP club membership has been renewed.
- Currently working on housing assignments for Camp Perry.
- Matches have been approved by the NRA for the coming year.

Junior Program

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Still running smoothly. We did have a power outage on Monday 2/13 so it was cancelled for the evening. Still averaging around 15 shooters each week, and we have seen a few new kids show up to give air rifle a try.
- We did hear back from Kay Hughes about our NRA grant proposal. The state committee approved \$2895.63 for the purchase of new equipment. Still needs approval from the National organization, but we should be good to go. Final award will probably be presented at the White Rose Friends of the NRA banquet on March 3rd.
- We were approached by Dennis Sprenkle, Comander of the Central York AFJROTC, a few weekend ago. He has about 20 students that want to start an air rifle program at the high school. Will discuss further in new business.

Building and Grounds

- George Himmelright gave the report.
- More of the split wood was staked under the wood shelter.
- Tyler Glock's Eagle Scout project will begin soon. Expenses will be paid for by the club and the labor will be provided by Tyler Glock.
- We did get one bid in for the electrical work that needs to be done around the club grounds. This will include three dusk to dawn lights in the parking area, and electrical upgrades in the garage.
- Fire brick will need to be replaced in the fireplace.

Legislative

- Nothing really new. There will be three judge positions in the the county, and new DA for York County.

Old Business

- President Doug Nace was officially installed for the club. This was officiated by Director Greg Livingston.
- Steve Hughes passed away recently at the age of 62. He was a former Vice President for the club. A number of York Riflemen members were present for the viewing.

New Business

- As mentioned in the junior report the Central York AFJROTC want to start up an air rifle program at the high school. The commander of the AFJROTC asked if we could share our equipment until such time that they raise the funds to purchase their own equipment. Due to the logistics of this proposal it would not be feasible. Coach Jeff Walters suggested that we loan 3-4 of the air rifles that we are currently not using to the AFJROTC along with a monetary donation of 3-500 dollars to help them achieve their end goal. After discussion with the membership it was decided to donate 4 air rifles to the AFJROTC on

behalf of the club. Coach Jeff Walters will also donate some of his own targets, pellets and instructional materials to the AFJROTC.

Good or Welfare of the Club

- John Stare suggested that the club purchase new furniture for the clubhouse.
- A proposal to reserve the clubhouse on June 3rd for hunter/trapper class. Will need to use the clubhouse between 8-3 during the day.
- Also discussed the proposed changes to the hunting regulations including semi automatics, air rifles for small game, etc

Adjournment

- A motion was made by Greg Livingston and seconded by Dick Ide to adjourn the meeting. Motion was approved and the meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM
