Meeting Minutes for March 13, 2018

- The York Rifle Range Association meeting for March 13, 2018 was called to order by Doug Nace at 7:30 pm with 15 members present.

Pledge of allegiance was recited by the group.

Minutes of previous meeting.

- The Minutes of the February 13, 2018 meeting were read by Secretary Jeff Walters.
- No corrections were needed and a motion was made by Greg Livingston and seconded by Frank Herring to approve. Motion was approved by members present

Treasurer's Report

- The monthly Treasurer's report was prepared by Cheryl Gerhart and submitted by George Himmelright.

- All club accounts will be audited at the end of the year.

Membership Report

- Membership Secretary, Jim Jensen gave the report.
- Membership totals are as follows: 1124 Senior, 53 Junior, 331 Life, 3 Active Military, 1511 Total
- Presented to membership 1 junior membership application, also the youngest on club record at 1 month, 11 days. Will be voted on during the April meeting
- Invitations for membership have we sent out to the first batch of people on the wait list. There will be 29 senior and 7 juniors attend the April orientation.
- Current wait list is 58 senior and 0 junior.
- Will have new member orientation April, May and June, then the open spots will be filled. This will leave, at this time, 10 people on the wait list for the 2019 membership drive.

Smallbore Report

- Greg Livingston gave the report.
- We have had three matches since the last meeting. No points were earned, and we are still in 4th place. Two matches are left for the indoor season and both are away matches at Palmyra and Columbia.
- Summer outdoor season will start at the end of April.
- League banquet will be hosted by Columbia this year. Location and date is not finalized.

Big Bore Report

- Fred Haag gave the report.
- First match for the year will be a CMP Garand match followed by 500 agg NRA highpower match on April 22nd.

- Fred is looking for a person to run the July 22nd match. A leg match at New Holland is the same day and Fred along with other York team members will be attending the leg match to prepare for Camp Perry. If no one is available to run the local match it will be cancelled.
- A beginners highpower class will be sponsored by Harrisburg Hunters and Anglers April 7th. Class side is limited and is open to those people that can physically get into position, etc.

Junior Program Report

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Still going smoothly, 10-15 shooters each week at Monday night air rifle.
- Two new junior shooters will be joining the smallbore team for the outdoor season in April
- Since the newsletter release 2-3 new shooters have joined us on Monday nights
- We got final approval of our two NRA grants. State approved approx \$7400 but at the national level it was reduced to \$6400. Items approved with the grant is (7) Crosman Challenger PCP air rifles, 2 cases of CCI Standard velocity .22 ammo, one case of Eley match ammo, (4) spotting scopes, and NRA Foundation promotional banners.
- There is a rumor that the JROTC marksmanship program at Central York has been cancelled due to the shooting in Florida. Will make contact with the instructor at Central to confirm status and disposition of the equipment we donated to them last year.
- Trinity Bogdany shot well at the regional 3p match at Ontelaunee last month. She came in 2nd place in her age group and was in the “middle of the pack” of the 30 shooters that participated beating many shooters older than her

Building and Grounds Report

- George Himmelright gave the report.
- Thank you to Devin Pence for filling the coal bin with firewood.
- Oil tank has been filled, gate fixed, and the septic tank pumped.
- Ron Huyett has replaced the roof on the pistol range shelter, with a metal and clear plastic roof. The front section has been raised to hopefully eliminate gunshot damage. Still need to work on the drainage and possible add gravel in front of the shooting bench.
- Spring work days are scheduled for 3/31 and 4/28. Work involves cutting, splitting, stacking wood, replacement of some target frame wood, and general spring cleaning.
- Board of Directors will have info submitted on a new tractor to replace the old Ford tractor. Ford tractor is still for sale.

Legislative Report

- Petitions for primary ballot are out now.
- Debates for the Republican governor have been televised.

Old Business

- Lighting for the the lower lot will be placed, just waiting for some bids to be submitted.

- Club received certificate of membership to the PA Rifle and Pistol Association.

Good or Welfare of the Club

- CMP has been authorized to sell USGI surplus 1911's this year. They also received an additional 100K M1 Garands that will be available to purchase this year.
- A ceremonial flag and certificate was given to the club by Lt. Col Matthew Hendell. The flag and certificate is on the mantel and it was flown on a C130 during an important mission in Afghanistan.
