- First club matches were held on April 22nd. 27 attended the CMP Garand match with Sean Leighton as overall winner. 15 Participated in the 500 agg NRA Highpower match with Frank Wasco as overall winner.
- Next match will be an 800 agg NRA Highpower match on May 27th.

Junior Program Report

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Still going well, averaging 10 shooters each week.
- Last Monday night air rifle session before we break for the summer will be on May 21st. We will start back up again early September.
- Working on getting some of our more experienced junior shooter to sign up for the smallbore prone school and 3200 match sponsored by Seitzland in June.
- We still have not received our NRA grant air rifles. Will contact to see if a new timeframe is in place for delivery.
- The BOD and Officers approved the purchase of a high pressure air pump to aid in filling new air rifles. It has not been ordered yet due to the fact that it is on back order and we have not received our Grant air rifle allotment. The money used to purchase the air pump will come from donations given to the club over the last year.

Building and Grounds Report

- WE patched potholes around the clubhouse, and used 12 bags of cold patch to fill the worst potholes.
