Meeting Minutes for 6/9/2020

- The York Rifle Range Association meeting for June 9, 2020 was called to order by Doug Nace at 7:30pm with 14 members present.

Pledge of allegiance was recited by the group.

Minutes of previous meeting.

- The Minutes of the March membership meeting as well as the May directors meeting were read by Secretary Jeff Walters.
- No corrections were needed and a motion was made to accept the directors meeting minutes. This motion was approved. The March membership meeting minutes were approved during the previous directors meeting in May.

Treasurer's Report

- First three matches were cancelled and postponed to a later date due to Covid-19. Did have our first outdoor match this past Friday evening. South team won with a packed firing line.
- League banquet has been postponed and rescheduled for August 8th at 6PM. York is hosting it this year and instead of the original plan to have it catered we will have a simple picnic with burgers, hotdogs, and typical picnic fare. Awards have been ordered, should be done in a few weeks.

Big Bore Report

- Fred Haag gave the report.
- Managed to have a match at the end of May once York county went into yellow phase. Had 21 shooters. Top shooter was Jeff Browning from Virginia. High service rifle was Matt Slocum.
- As a thank to the competitors that helped with pit rehab match fees were waived.
- Next match is June 28th.

- No match in July. This was because of the Nationals occurring at the same time. Since nationals have been cancelled there are replacement/substitute matches being held. Reade Range is hosting one of those substitute matches and many of our regular shooters will be attending them instead.
- CMP has come out with their “Home Range Appreciation matches” to make up for the cancelled nationals. Our August match will tie into this event and will be like a postal version competing with scores nationwide.
- Cancelled Garand match will be on Sept 13th.
- New target carriers worked well with one exception of a broken bracket.

Junior Program Report

- Jeff Walters gave the report.
- Received an email from the NRA Foundation and due to the Covid pandemic everything has been placed on hold. We are still waiting on some grant ammo, at this point we may or may not get it. Smallbore practice has been going well.

Building and Grounds Report

- Need to fill coal bin with firewood for the fall.
- Bids are due for the logging contract tomorrow.

- George, due to age and health, would like to step back from head of Building and grounds, and try to find someone who will to take a lead in that department.

Old Business

- Pit refurbishment is going well. Carriers worked well except for some stress on fittings. Solution has been found and just need to be fixed. Looking at conex box for storage near the pit. Will get prices and plan to order soon. Cost estimate sheet has been prepared for the back wall and roof. Can reuse some of the lumber salvaged.
- Fortunately, many members have removed their tree stands. Plan on removing the derelict stands in the next few months.
- Precision rifle series is becoming a popular sport in shooting. Looking at adding steel targets and obstacles to shoot from. Will need to address some of the logistics and will continue to study the implementation.
