Legislative Report

- Doug Nace has a report. Safari Club Intl is concerned about new California legislation that prohibits the use of firearms for people under the age of twenty one. This includes the buying of firearms, ammunition, and competition. Law would also prohibit the discussion of firearms with juniors.
- Visa and Mastercard now have a new code to identify firearms dealers separate from other sporting goods stores. This information can be used to track firearms and ammunition purchases.
- Keep working our elected officials in regards to gun rights.
- Get educated and vote in November. It is important that pro gun rights politicians get elected.
